TO THE BOARD OF MANAGERS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS SOCIETY OF THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF THE SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

I, John Richard AVERY, being of the age of 21 years hereby apply for membership in this Society by right of lineal descent in the following line from

Caleb Olin who was born in Warrick, E.I. on the 8 day of Dec. 17 53 and died in Potsdam, N.Y. on the 7 day of Aug. 1858. and who assisted in establishing American Independence.

I was born in Austin County of Minnesota on the 25 day of June 1888

(3) great-grandson of Alexander Stuart born 1820, died 1920, married Feb 16 his wife Hannah F. Olin born 1820, died 1892, married 1851
(4) great-great-grandson of Caleb Olin, Jr. born 1778, died Aug 15 and his wife Polly Moore born 1791, died 1900, married Dec 8 Aug 9
(5) great-great-grandson of Caleb Olin born 1753, died 1858, and his wife Frelige Mitchell born 1755, died 1854, married Jan 1
(6) great-great-great-grandson of Henry Olin born 1719, died 1825, and his wife born died married
(7) great-great-great-great-grandson of John Olin born died and his wife Susanna Spence born died married
and he, the said Caleb Olin (No. 5.) is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Private

NOTE: By Constitutional Amendment adopted May 17, 1927, Article III, Section 1, quoted below, was changed so that any man of 18 years of age is eligible to membership. Further amendments have been indicated similarly.

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unequalled support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unflinching in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or minute man in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain. - Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 9, 1887, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original. State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestors, with dates of birth and death, if known. By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.
